



## **SILVERADO BELMONT HILLS COVID-19 UPDATE**

*January 23, 2021*

Dear Family and Friends,

I am pleased to announce that our vaccine clinic dates have been confirmed with the CVS On-Site Vaccine COVID-19 Team.

- Clinic #1      Sunday, January 31, 2021 from 10:00 am – 4:00 pm  
This is 1<sup>st</sup> vaccine for all residents and associates who signed up
- Clinic #2      Sunday, February 21, 2021 from 10:00 am – 4:00 pm  
This is 2<sup>nd</sup> vaccine for all residents and associates who received the 1<sup>st</sup> vaccine on 1/31/21 and anyone who did not receive the first vaccine.
- Clinic #3      Sunday, March 14, 2021 from 10:00 am – 4:00 pm  
Final vaccine only for 2<sup>nd</sup> (final shot) for residents and associates

As of today, we believe everyone will receive the Pfizer vaccines. If you have any concerns as to whether your loved one, should receive their vaccine, please contact their PCP to discuss. Previous CDC guidelines had recommended waiting 90 days for anyone who had tested positive for COVID-19. Most recently it has been suggested, that even with a positive previous test, if you have no current active symptoms, such as a fever, you should consider getting the vaccine. We strongly encourage your discussion with your loved ones PCP. In my opinion, it is a highly personal decision and I know you will make the best decision with the information presented.

If you have any questions this week, please reach out to me or any member of the management team and we will get back to you as quickly as we can with an answer.

Directors, including Glynis Marcantel, RN., and myself, will be on site for our clinics and we have some home office support staff coming to assist. We will follow CDC guidelines and monitor all residents and associates for signs and symptoms of adverse reaction.

We request your continued patience as all our associates are hands on with our residents to care for their needs. This includes our engagement associates, directors, and maintenance moving beds at a moment's notice and of course our nurses and caregivers.

We continue to follow San Mateo County Public Health guidelines and are testing all residents and associates weekly. It is a nasal swab method. If a resident tests positive for the COVID virus, we are contacting the resident's responsible party. If anyone tests positive, they are not retested for 90 days, per CDC guidelines.
